a. U.S. History/Social Science

2 YEARS

1 year of World History
1 year of U.S. History or
1 semester of U.S. History & 1 semester of Civics
or 1 semester of American Government

b. English

4 YEARS

c. Math

3 YEARS

Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, etc. (4 years recommended)

d. Laboratory Science*

2 YEARS

Biology, Chemistry, Physics (3 years recommended)

e. Language other than English

2 YEARS

Must be the same language (3 years recommended)

f. Visual and Performing Arts*

1 YEAR

Art, Drama, Music, etc.

* CAVA students may choose to take Lab Science and VPA at community college to go above and beyond in demonstrating college readiness.

g. College Preparatory Electives

1 YEAR

(year long course)

Visual and Performing Arts, History, English, Social Science,
advanced Math, Lab Science, languages other than English
