The George Washington University Online High School (GWUOHS) is an independent private school for students in grades 8–12. Founded in 2010, the school's mission is to serve students from across the United States and around the world, who desire a flexible yet rigorous college preparatory education.

All classes are taught through online instruction, both synchronous and asynchronous, and include regular teacher interaction and support. In addition to "live" online class sessions, students attend teachers' office-hour sessions to receive additional direct instruction.
