### CURRICULUM

Course selections include multiple options of pre-approved core subjects that satisfy school credit requirements for graduation at K12 Private Academy. ## GRADING SCALE

The student must have been enrolled for at least two consecutive terms on a full-time basis. The following comment will be placed on each student's transcript, "The weighted GPA for transfer courses will be based on K12 Private/International Academy's guidelines for assigning quality points".
