High School Graduation Requirements**

History/Social Studies: 30 credits (3 years)

- Modern World Studies: 1 year
- US History: 1 year
- US Government: 1 semester
- Economics: 1 semester

English: 40 credits (4 years)

Math: 20 Credits (2 years)

- Algebra I required

Science: 20 credits (2 years)

- Life Science (Biology): 1 year
- Physical Science (Physical Science, Earth Science, Chemistry Physics): 1 year

World Language/Fine Arts: 20 credits (2 years)

- World Language: 1 year
- Fine Arts or a 2nd year of a World Language

Physical Education: 20 credits (2 years)

Health: 5 credits (1 semester)

Electives: 65 credits

Total Credits Needed to Graduate = 220 credits

**California State University and University
of California “a-g” Entrance Requirements**

a. US History/Social Science: 2 years

World History: 1 year
US History: 1 year or US History 1 semester & Civics or American Government 1 semester

b. English: 4 years

c. Math: 3 years

Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II (4 years recommended)

d. Laboratory Science*: 2 years

Biology, Chemistry, Physics (3 years recommended)

e. Language other than English*: 2 years Must be the same language (3 years recommended)

f. Visual and Performing Arts*: 1 year
Art, Drama, Music, etc.

g. College Preparatory Electives: 1 year
Visual and Performing Arts, History, English, Social Science, advanced math, Lab Science, languages other than English

** Due to the virtual nature of our program, University of California does not currently recognize Lab and VPA classes as a-g approved. These courses are in the submission process and will be pending for the 2017-2018 school year. Students may take these courses at a local community college to meet enrollment requirements.*
