I. CALL TO ORDER

Mrs. Sara Struhs called the meeting to order at 5:02 PM.

I. Discussion Items

- a) Dr. Medley presented information regarding the appeal of three withdrawals of students, elaborating on the mitigations utilized in an effort to avoid this process. Unfortunately, the attempts were unsuccessful, therefore the school moved forward with the withdrawals.

The committee agreed to uphold the withdrawals and recommends the board confirm the withdrawals at its next meeting, with the understanding that one may be pulled if the student shows marked improvement.

- b) A request was made to conduct, if necessary an Academic Committee meeting, May 17, 2018, at 5 PM to address any final withdrawals. The ED will inform the committee if it becomes necessary.
- c) Mrs. Gina Little presented the EC data for the interim assessment and what an IEP is. Nine students in 6th grade and fourteen in the 8th showed growth compared to the previous assessment. Eighth grade science yielded 43.75% proficiency rate. High school yielded the following:

Course	Proficient
a. Math 1	65.4%
b. English 2	31%
c. Biology	66%

Additionally, information regarding our ALP program and the number of students involved was presented.

- d) Ms. Jill Curtis presented the elementary school data. She listed the participation rate and average score for Math, Reading and fifth grade science. Further, BOY and MOY data from DIBELS was discussed.

- e) Mrs. Sonimar Villegas discussed the middle school data, particularly presenting the participation rates and growth data for each grade level by subject. It was noted that the majority of students are making growth.

- f) Mrs. Marcia Simmons shared the high school data for the second semester. Based on the data the current pass rate for Math 1 is 65.2%, 9th grade, 81% for 8th grade. English 2 is yielding 86.5% and Biology 64.4%. Additionally, she shared information regarding the colleges that our graduating class has been accepted into and some of the scholarships awarded.

With all business concluded Mrs. Sara Struhs adjourned the meeting.
