

# Kindergarten Daily Checklist



## Learning Coach Checklist

- Focus on lesson objectives – found at the beginning of each lesson
- Check Daily Plan for any ClassConnect Sessions.
- Read Kmail.
- Log in 60 minutes of health every day.
- Take attendance and log in progress daily.
- Log supplemental time daily-reading, educational TV shows, educational websites, etc.
- Remember to take a break every 20 minutes to recharge your kinder kiddo.

## Daily Reading Checklist

- One Phonics, Language Skills, Literature & Comprehension, and Handwriting lesson each day
- Sing ABC's. Use alphabet flashcards to practice letter/sound recognition.
- Student reads orally 20 minutes a day (Phonics Works Readers)
- Read to your child at least 20 minutes daily.
- Shared reading – see the grid below
- Sight word practice –OLS>Phonics> units 12,18,24,30 and 36 have sight word drills in the resources at the bottom of the lesson page. Use sight word flashcards for at least 10 minutes a day.

	Reading
Modeled	Teacher reads aloud, modeling how good readers read fluently and with expression. Books too difficult for students to read themselves are used. Examples: reading aloud and listening centers
Shared	Teacher and students read books together, with the students following as the teacher reads and then repeating familiar refrains. Books students can't read by themselves are used. Examples: big books, partner reading
Interactive	Teacher and students read together and take turns doing the reading. The teacher helps students read fluently and with expression. Instruction-level books are used. Examples: choral reading and readers theatre.
