### SOUTH CAROLINA VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL

The South Carolina Virtual Charter School (SCVCS) is a virtual, tuition-free public school chartered by the South Carolina Public Charter School District in 2008. SCVCS uses the K12 curriculum and patented online learning program. Together, SCVCS and K12 offer a competitive, individualized kindergarten through twelfth grade school program.

**Why a Virtual School?** Virtual schools exist to serve the students who would better thrive outside the four walls of a traditional classroom. Specific reasons why families choose a *Powered by K12* education for their child:

- The student is academically advanced and the classroom pace moves too slowly.
- The student is an elite athlete or youth performer with a busy travel schedule.
- The student is homebound, undergoing medical treatment.
- The student can take individual courses not available in his or her own school or home district.

### DEMOGRAPHICS

- SCVCS is one of the largest virtual public charter school in South Carolina with the enrollment of 3,785 students
- SCVCS is in its eleventh year of operation. SCVCS's governing board consists of seven board members who meet on a monthly basis to establish policies, procedures, approve school budgets and provide oversight of the school management.
- Seventy-five percent of SCVCS's students are Caucasian, twenty-five percent of the students are minority. Forty-four percent are male and fifty-six percent are female.
- SCVCS serves students in every county in South Carolina.
- Seventy-four percent of SCVCS students previously attended a public school. Twelve percent were home schooled, fourteen percent transferred from private or other charter school, fifty six percent are free and reduced and eleven percent are Special Needs students.

### CURRICULUM

The established curriculum clearly outlines learning objectives to be mastered in each lesson, unit, and semester, crafted from educational research, state and national standards, and deep content expertise. After establishing the learning objectives for each course, strategies for best accomplishing the established objectives are used such as online content, engaging demonstrations, offline science labs, offline reading materials or activities, interactive online discussions, and assessments to measure mastery of objectives.

Live class connect classes are available on a daily basis.

## GRADING POLICIES

### AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

#### Grading Scale

The SCVCS high school program uses the South Carolina mandated Uniform Grading Scale effective for all students receiving Carnegie units:

#### Dual Credit

Dual Credit is an opportunity offered by SCVCS to give high school students (generally juniors and seniors) the opportunity to take college-level courses at their local technical college or four-year college. Please contact your advisor for more information.

#### Advanced Placement Courses

SCVCS offers several Advanced Placement® (AP) courses. These courses have the potential for college-level credit depending upon successful completion of the course and a minimum score on the AP exam. Colleges determine whether the student receives credit for the AP course.

#### Grades

Each student has an individualized semester GPA, plus a cumulative GPA calculated from the beginning of ninth grade that includes grades from all classes. AP and dual credit courses are weighted to include an additional 1.0 GPA.

#### SC Graduation Requirements

To be eligible to receive a South Carolina High School Diploma, students must earn twenty-four Carnegie units, and demonstrate computer literacy. Based on South Carolina Code of Regulations, 43-234(l) (A), requirements to receive a SC high School diploma for students in grades 9-12 are as follows:

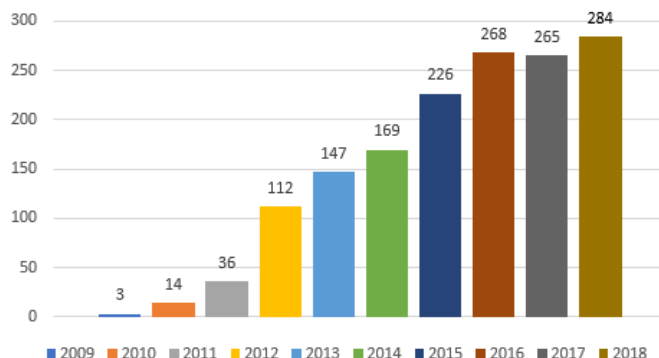
