Description: This research-based course focuses on computational fluency, conceptual understanding, and problem-solving. This course for students in Grade 3 provides a quick overview of whole number addition and subtraction, but has a greater focus on whole number multiplication and division, encompassing early algebraic thinking.

Course Title: Fourth Grade Math

Prerequisite: Course completion or grade placement.

Materials: See syllabus

Description: This research-based course focuses on computational fluency, conceptual understanding, and problem-solving. This course for students in Grade 4 moves into applications and properties of operations. Students work with simple fraction and decimal operations, which are applied in the study of measurement, probability, and data, and mathematical reasoning techniques.

Course Title: Fifth Grade Math

PEIMS Course Title/Number: Mathematics, Grade 5/02640050

Prerequisite: Course completion or grade placement.

Materials: See syllabus

Description: This research-based course focuses on computational fluency, conceptual understanding, and problem-solving. This course for students in Grade 5 investigates whole numbers through practical



situations in rounding, exponents and powers, and elementary number theory.

Course Title: Sixth Grade Math

PEIMS Course Title/Number: Mathematics, Grade 6/02640060

Prerequisite: Course completion or grade placement.

Materials: See syllabus

Description: Students enhance computational and problem-solving skills while learning topics in algebra, geometry, probability, and statistics. They solve expressions and equations, study plane and solid figures, work with integers, learn multiple representations for communicating information, investigate patterns, and apply number theory and computation to mathematical puzzles.

Course Title: Seventh Grade Math-Pre Algebra

PEIMS Course Title/Number: Mathematics, Grade 7/03103000

Prerequisite: Course completion or grade placement.

Description: Students take a broader look at computational and problem-solving skills while learning the language of algebra. Description: Topics included are real numbers, simplifying real number expressions with and without variables, solving linear equations and inequalities, solving quadratic equations, graphing linear and quadratic equations, polynomials, factoring, linear patterns, linear systems of equality and inequality, simple matrices, sequences, and radicals.

Course Title: Third Grade History

Description: Continuing their investigation (spanning grades 1–4) into history from the Stone Age to the Space Age, as well as Communities. Third grade students will study Communities, Citizenship and Government, America's Past, the Nations Growth and Change, Ancient Rome, the Rise and Fall of Rome, and the Rise of Islam.

Students investigate Native American civilizations; follow the path of European exploration and colonization; assess the causes and consequences of the American Revolution; examine the Constitution and the growth of the new nation; and analyze what led to the Civil War and its aftermath.

movements, dialogue, and emotions express ideas; how voice and diction express thought and feelings, create scenes including setting, character, and plot, compare and contrast performances; understand and apply technical elements that are used to create scenery properties, lighting, sound, costume, make-up, and the role of the director; role of theatre, film, television, and media in American society; theatre reflection of eras, relevance and influence of theatrical heritage on daily life; proper audience behavior, production elements of dramatic media; and different theatrical occupations. Synchronous session will be utilized for instruction.
